## BACHELOR OF ARTS

The General Arts program will provide you with the opportunity to discover what university really has to offer. The program overcomes the restrictions of traditional programs by giving students as much flexibility as possible when choosing their courses. The program allows you to design your degree by giving you the opportunity to select courses from a broad range of disciplines in the Humanities and Social Sciences.

The General Arts program is ideal if you are looking for a broad education at the university level, or if you are exploring your options before selecting a particular major or a particular discipline. The student can take any fifteen (15) full course equivalents with only the following restrictions:

1. A maximum of seven (7) first year or zero level courses may be taken.
2. At least two (2) courses must be taken at the third year level or above.
3. A majority of the fifteen (15) courses for the BA degree must be Arts courses. No more than four (4) courses may be taken outside of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities and the Faculty of Science and Environmental Studies. Pre-Service Education courses may not be credited.
4. The last five (5) full course equivalents must be taken while registered in either the Bachelor of Arts (General Program) except with permission of the Dean or the Dean's delegate.


